Jewish Adult Learning - 2026

Check out Adult Education with Rabbi Kummer. We typically meet on the fourth Wednesday of the month. We will complete our fifth class for 2025 on August 20. It's not too late to register. We'll start a new session after High Holidays. You can register for one class (\$25 per class) or register for all five (\$100.) Tentatively classes will be held on the fourth Wednesday of each month beginning in January. Due to the Passover Holiday, we will skip the month of April. Each session will run from 7:30-8:45 p.m. and will be virtual ("Zoom"). Participants can register for all classes or individual sessions. Any session for which there are fewer than 4 registered participants will be cancelled. . Schedule of classes for 2026 will be available by Rosh Hashannah.

Topics may include: Facing the future without fear; Hope – a Jewish concept?; Jewish views of the afterlife; Jewish humor: laughing through the tears; Yom Hashoah: Where was God during the Holocaust?; The Development of Hassidism; Vashti and Esther: a Feminist Perspective; Who wrote the Bible? ; Rabbi Roland Gittelsohn's Iwo Jima Eulogy to his Fallen Comrades.

NOTE: We have one last class remaining in 2025 on Wednesday, August 20. Go to our website to register. Cost is \$25. Topic is: As the Year Turns: Reflecting on Jewish High Holiday Themes and Our Lives. We will review some of the major themes of the Jewish High Holiday season and discuss their relevance for people living in this day.

Rabbi Judith Kummer was ordained as a rabbi at the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College in Philadelphia in 1995 and has been leading High Holiday services with the BCC-JCG since 2002. She is a professionally-trained and board-certified interfaith chaplain, and she has recently opened a spiritual care private practice, “Rabbi Judith Kummer: Spiritual Support for Life’s Journey,” where she works remotely and in person, providing skilled spiritual care visits, bereavement support, lifecycle events and eldercare programming. Rabbi Kummer served as Executive Director of the Jewish Chaplaincy Council of MA for nearly two decades and has served as spiritual leader of Reconstructionist synagogues in New Jersey and New York. Prior to her work in the rabbinate, she served as the Housing Director at Barnard College and worked in low-income housing finance with the New York City. Rabbi Kummer received her BA in environmental studies and urban planning from Barnard College. She currently resides in Boston, MA.

About Cantorial Soloist Deborah Melkin



Deborah Melkin had served for many years as cantorial soloist at the Vilna Shul in Boston. Since 1998, she has been a member of the illustrious Zamir Chorale of Boston and has sung as part of a High Holiday solo quartet for Temple Israel in Sharon, MA. She is also a member of Il Concerto di Salamone Rossi Hebreo, a Boston-area group that performs Friday night Shabbat services using the Renaissance music of Jewish composer Salamone Rossi. She has sung a cappella with the Honorable Menschen and was a founding member of Brandeis’ a cappella group Manginah. In her non-singing life, Deborah lives in the greater Boston area with her husband and dog, spending her days working with data and databases. She is a regular speaker at industry conferences across the country.


